

## FAVORITE SCARF EVER

Pattern by Lisa Bruce (sunshinewalks)



**Yarn:** 1 skein Misti Alpaca Hand Paint Sock Yarn, or any fingering weight yarn, variegation creates happy stripes

**Materials:** size US 5 (3.75mm) (I use circls for everything, but straights are fine for this pattern)

**Gauge:** variable, the looser your gauge, the drapier the scarf will be

**Finished Measurements:** (approximately) 5" x 75"

### NOTES:

\*double decrease (DD) : slip 2 sts knitwise together, k1, pass 2 sts over

\*p2togtbl: purl 2 sts together through the back loop

\*p2tog: purl 2 sts together

\*yo: yarn over

**PATTERN:**

Begin by dividing your skein of yarn into two equal balls (this is easiest if you have a scale and you can weigh out two balls that are 50 grams each). This scarf is knit in two equal sections and seamed in the middle so the chevron pattern is symmetrical on each side of your neck.

With the first ball of yarn cast on 45 sts.

Knit two rows.

Row 1 (and all RS rows): (k4, yo, k1, yo, k4, DD) three times, k4, yo, k1, yo, k4 (47 sts)

Row 2 (and all WS rows): p2togtbl, purl to last 2 sts, p2tog

Repeat these two rows until you have just enough yarn left for 6 rows. Knit two rows stockinette stitch (knit the RS row, purl the WS row) and bind off loosely. Leave the long tail of yarn for later seaming.

Repeat with second ball of yarn.

Seam together the two halves of the scarf (if desired, you can also leave the stitches live and graft them together with kitchener stitch). Block for optimal results.
